1. **THINK IT** "It's important to keep our parks clean, but yelling might make someone feel defensive. Instead, you can gently remind them where the trash goes, or you can pick it up and show good behavior by example."
2. **SAY IT** "It's important to speak up politely to help keep our environment clean. Reminding others in a friendly way can make a big difference."
3. **THINK IT** "Sometimes new things can be confusing at first. Instead of complaining, try asking a teacher to explain it again so you can understand better."
4. **SAY IT** "Learning new things like recycling can be fun and important. Sharing what you know helps everyone get involved."
5. **THINK IT** "Everyone feels differently about community activities. It's nicer to encourage them or find a way to make the activity fun together."
6. **SAY IT** "Encouraging each other during hard work shows great teamwork. Your words can boost someone's spirit."
7. **THINK IT** "Hearing someone say unfair things can be upsetting, but arguing might not solve the problem. It might be more helpful to share positive stories about our community helpers to change their mind."
8. **SAY IT** "Speaking up with your ideas during discussions helps make decisions that everyone can be part of."
9. **THINK IT** "It's important to consider everyone's qualities fairly. If you have concerns, think about how to express them kindly or consider everyone's strengths."
10. **SAY IT** "Helping someone understand new rules is very kind and makes them feel welcome."

11. **THINK IT** "Being patient is part of being a good neighbor. Maybe a gentle reminder could help better than getting upset."
12. **SAY IT** "Volunteering shows you care about your community. It's a good way to learn responsibility and help others."
13. **THINK IT** "Not everyone remembers their responsibilities. You could help remind them what to do, or show them by picking up your own trash."
14. **SAY IT** "Offering to help others in your community is a wonderful way to show kindness and make new friends."
15. **THINK IT** "Fundraisers help our school, even if they seem boring. Maybe you can think of a way to make it more fun or suggest a new idea."
16. **SAY IT** "Sharing your passions and ideas can inspire fun activities that everyone can enjoy together."
17. **THINK IT** "Feeling upset about a decision is okay, but shouting isn't. You can talk about it later with someone who can explain why it was decided that way."
18. **SAY IT** "Teaching others skills you have learned is a great way to build stronger friendships and help out."
19. **THINK IT** "It's important to communicate if you're unhappy about being volunteered, but saying it angrily might upset your family. Later, you can calmly explain why you'd like to be asked next time."
20. **SAY IT** "Taking initiative to improve your community shows great citizenship. Projects like these can be fun and rewarding for everyone involved."
