“Small successes happen when I practice and take small steps.”



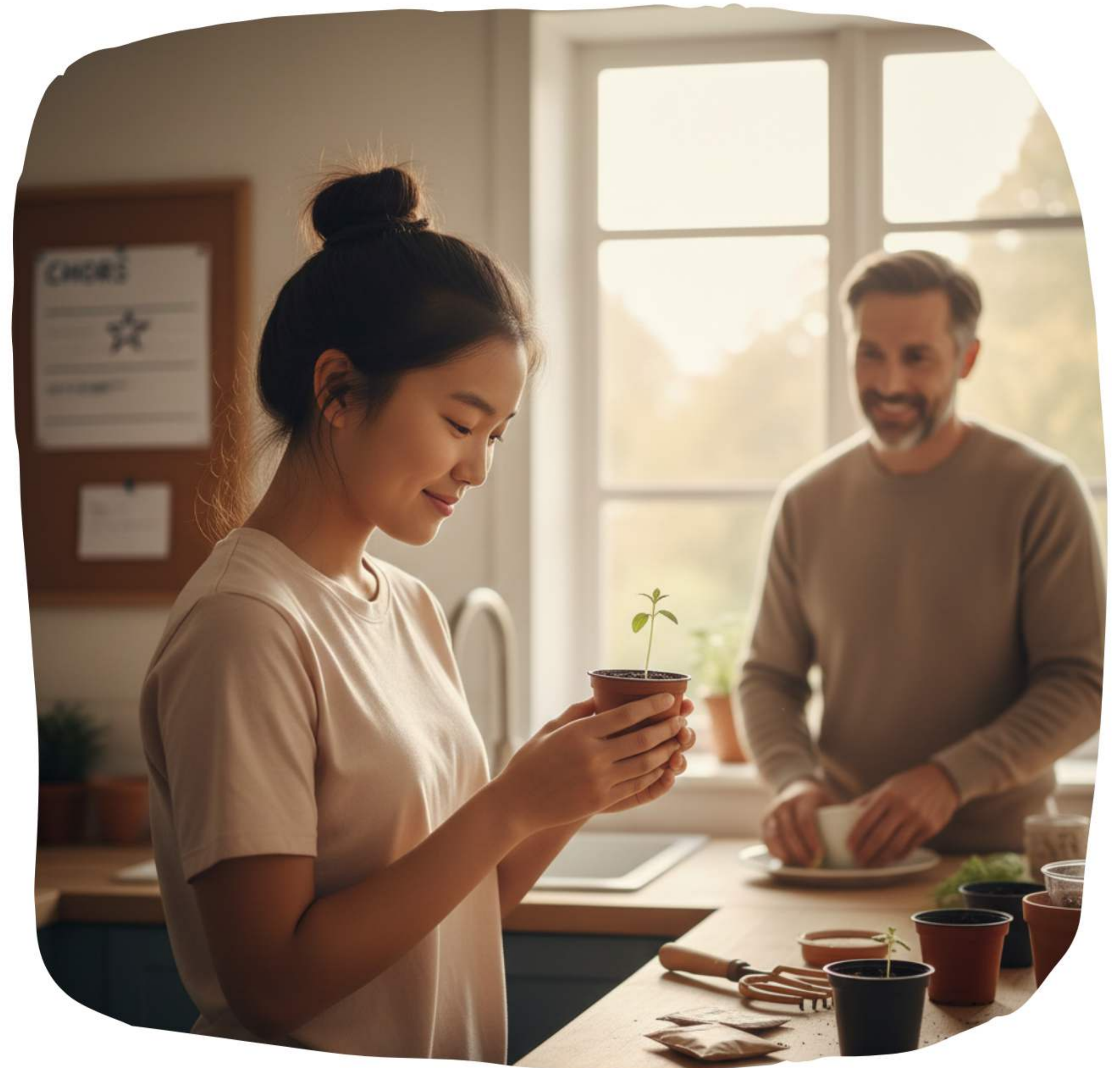
“I can celebrate by smiling, clapping, or telling myself, ‘I did it!’”

“Other people can be proud of my small successes too.”



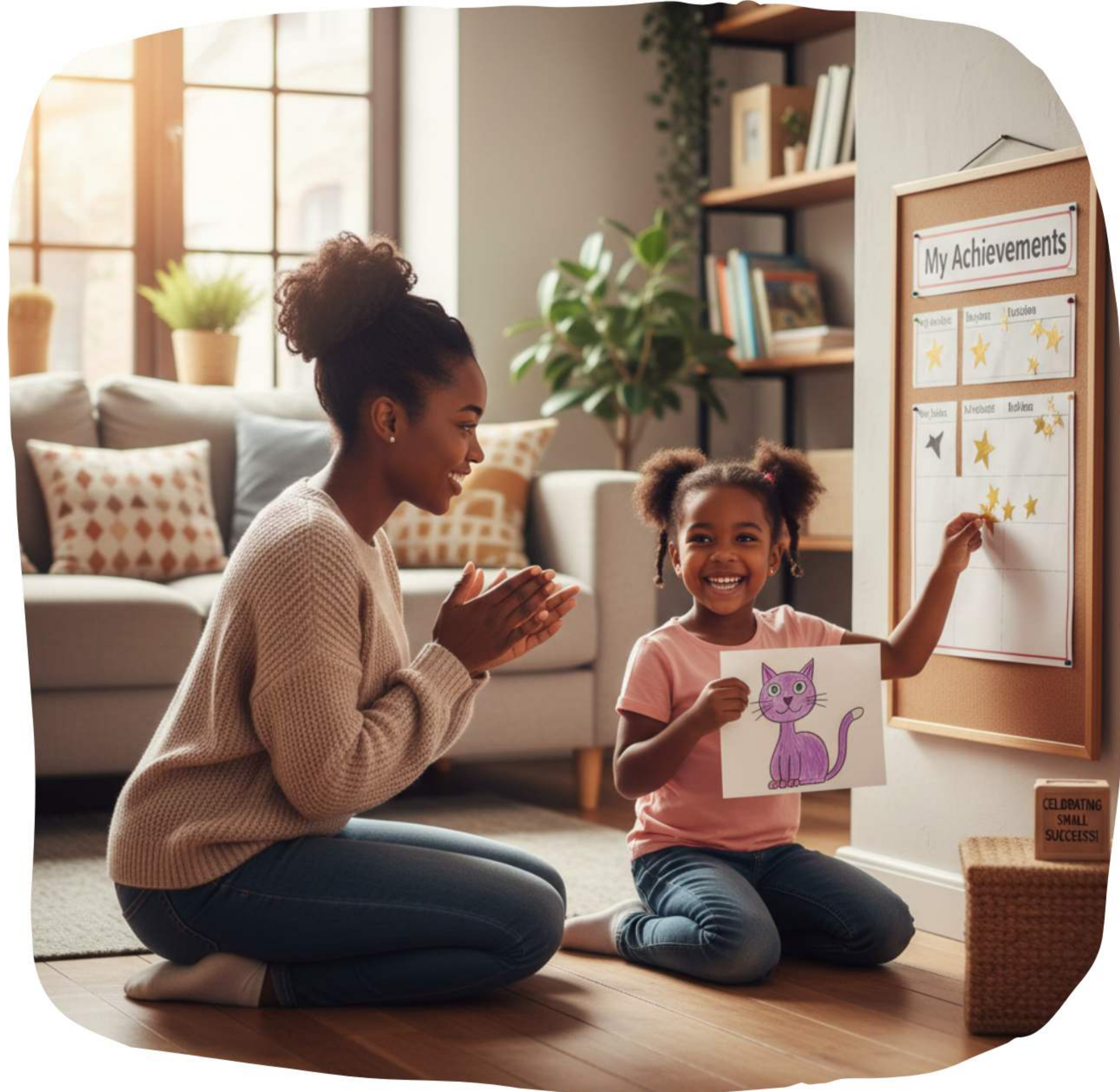
“I don’t have to wait for something big to celebrate myself.”
