unsafe.**



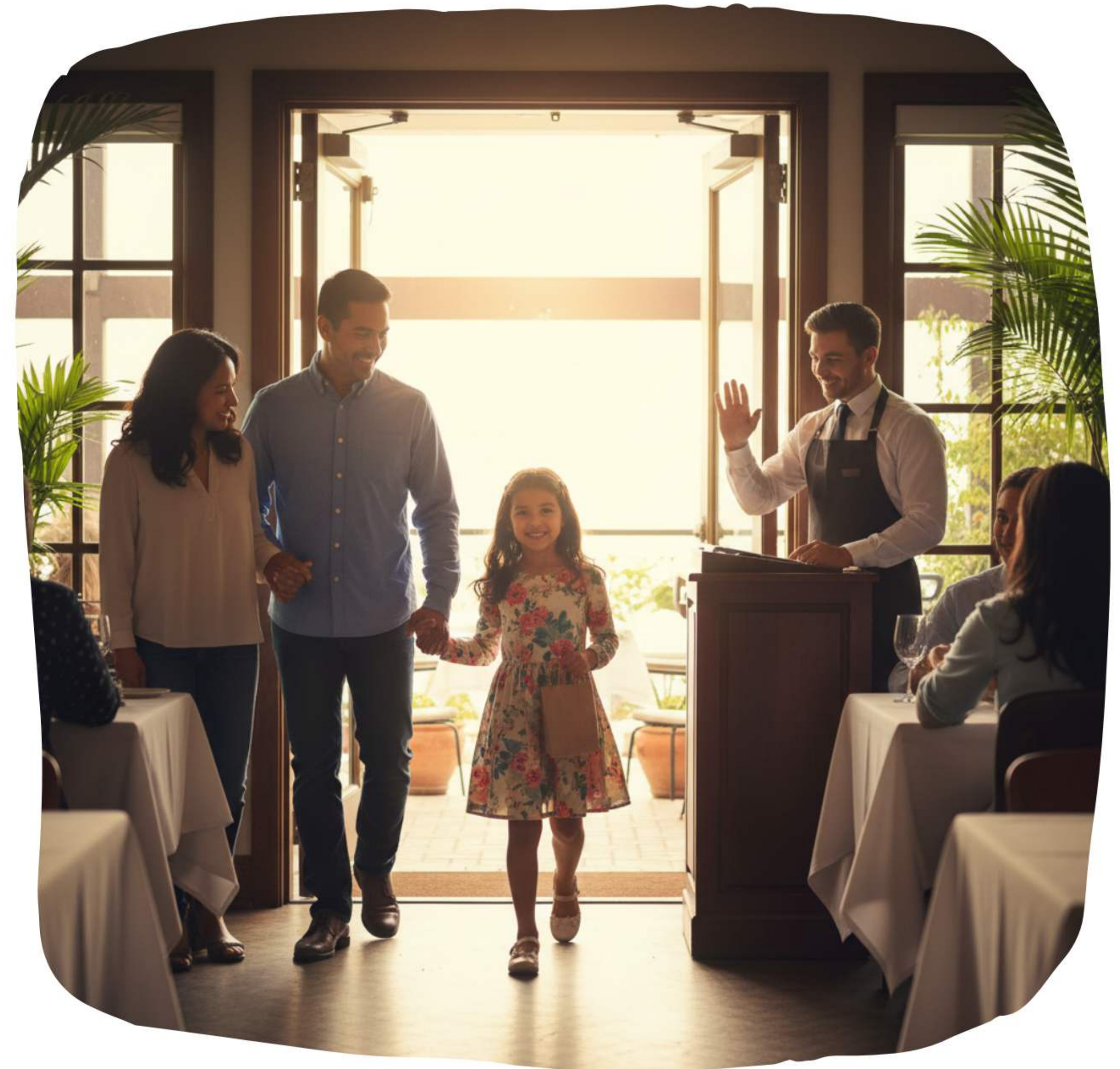
When I'm finished, I wipe my mouth and hands, and wait quietly for everyone else to finish.
