**In the library, I use a quiet voice and walk slowly so others can read peacefully.**



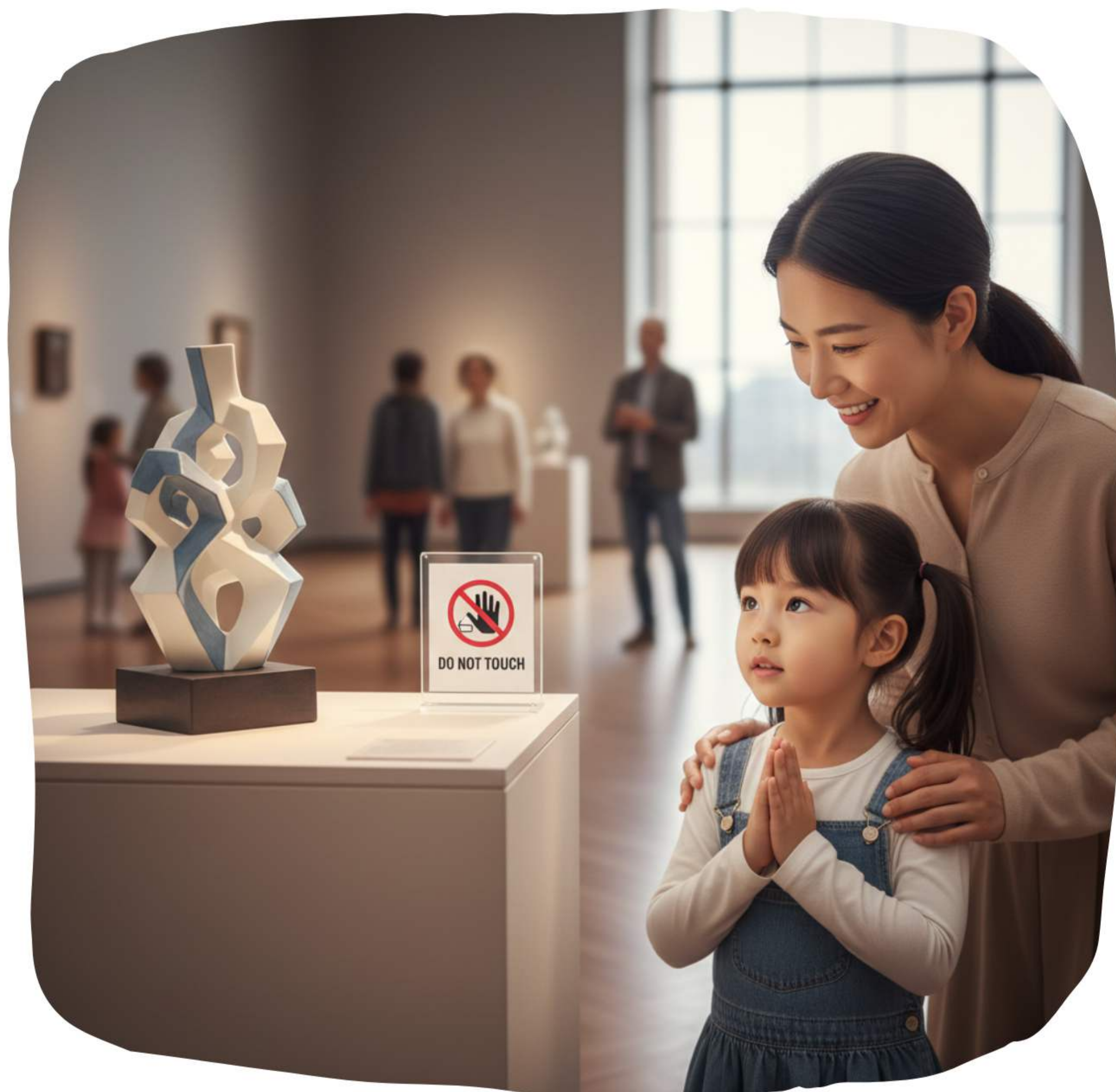
**In a restaurant, I sit calmly, use my manners, and wait patiently for my food.**

**In a store or mall, I stay close to the adult I came with and use an inside voice.**



**When I see a “Don’t Touch” sign, I remember to keep my hands to myself.**



**If there’s a rule I don’t understand, I can ask an adult, “What does this rule mean?”**



**When I follow rules, people around me feel safe, comfortable, and happy.**



**Sometimes I might forget a rule, but that's okay — I can listen to reminders and try again.**



**I can follow directions from signs, teachers, guards, or parents — they are all there to help me.**



**Following rules shows respect for others, responsibility for myself, and care for my surroundings.**



**When I follow rules, adults trust me more and let me do more things on my own.**



**Each time I follow the rules in public places, I make the world safer, kinder, and better for everyone!**
