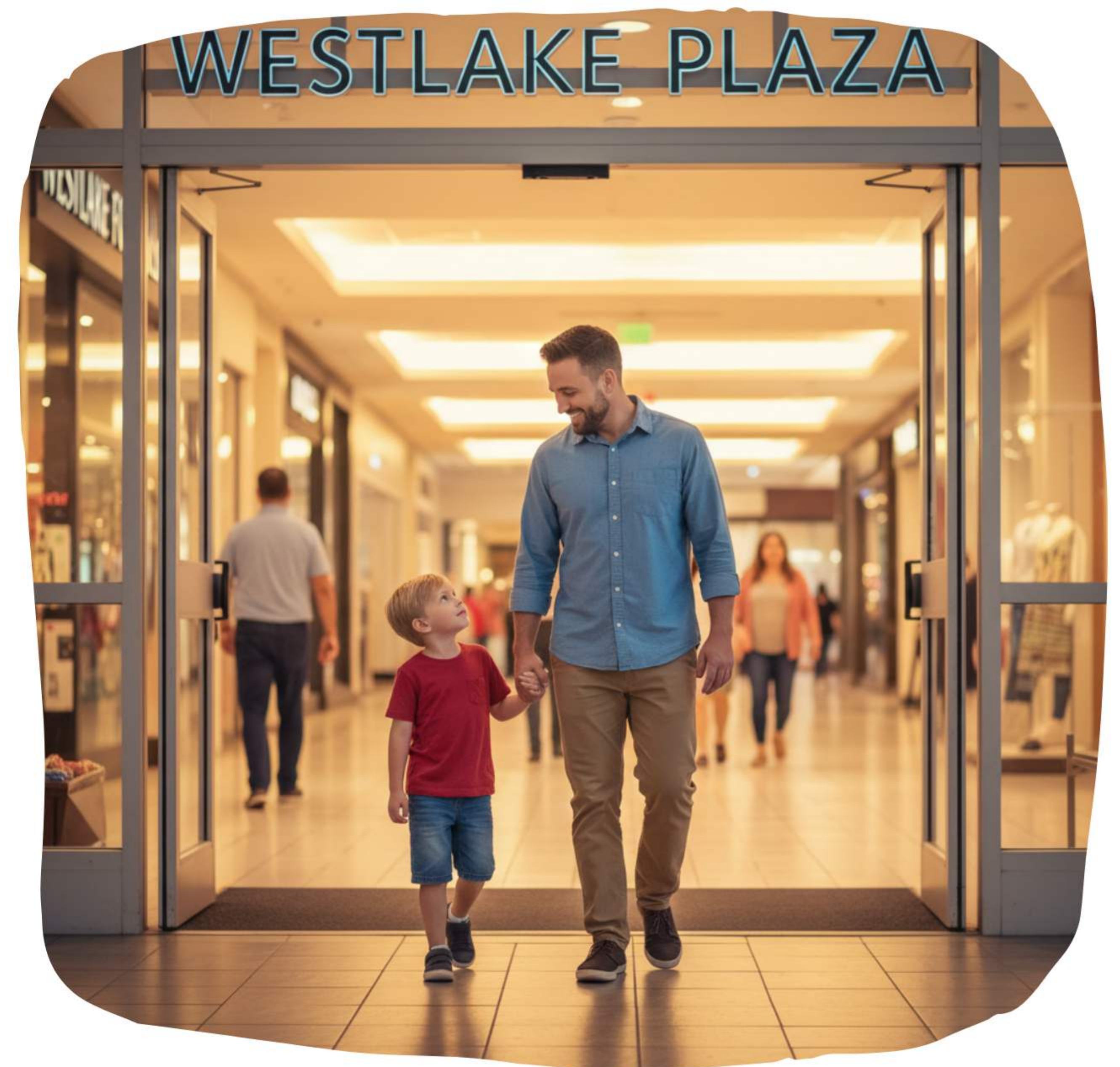




Sometimes I go to the mall with my family. The mall is a big place with many shops, lights, and people.

Sometimes we visit the food court. I can choose what I'd like to eat and sit quietly at the table.



I wait patiently while others order or finish their food. Waiting shows good manners.



When we go up or down on the escalator, I hold the handrail or an adult's hand carefully.



Before leaving, we might pay for things at the counter. I wait quietly until it's done.



When it's time to go home, I help carry small bags and walk safely to the car.



Every time I go to the mall and follow the rules, I stay safe, show good manners, and have fun with my family!

Role-Play Activity

- **Scenario 1**

Pretend you're entering a busy mall.

☞ Practice holding an adult's hand and walking calmly.

- **Scenario 2**

Pretend you see a toy you really like.

☞ Practice asking, "Can I have this, please?" and saying "Okay" if the answer is "Not today."

- **Scenario 3**

Pretend you lost sight of your parent for a moment.

☞ Practice stopping, staying in one place, and calling, "Mom!" or "Dad!" softly.

- **Scenario 4**

Pretend you're at the food court.

☞ Practice waiting quietly while someone orders food for you.
