



Sometimes, I meet new people at school, in the park, or at a party. Meeting new people can be fun!



When I meet someone new, I can introduce myself so they know who I am



**Introducing myself means
saying my name and a little
about me**



**I can start by saying, 'Hi, my
name is [Name]. What's your
name?'**



It's a good idea to smile when I say hello. Smiling helps people feel happy and welcome



If the person tells me their name, I can repeat it back to help me remember, like saying, 'Hi, [Their Name]!'



After introducing myself, I can ask a question to start a conversation, like, ‘What’s your favorite game?’



I can also share something about myself, like, ‘I love playing soccer. Do you like soccer too?’



If someone doesn't feel like talking, that's okay. I can wait and try again later



When I introduce myself, I use a calm and clear voice so others can hear me

**Practicing at home with my
family or friends can help me
feel ready to introduce myself**



When I introduce myself, I show that I want to be friendly and kind



Introducing myself helps me make new friends and feel more comfortable in new places

- What should you do when meeting someone new?

Creative Activity

- **Name Tag Design**

Help the child create a colorful name tag with their name and a picture of something they like, like a soccer ball or a star

- **Friendship Tree**

Draw a tree with branches and add "leaves" with the names of friends the child has introduced themselves to



Role-Play Activity

- **Scenario 1**

Pretend the child is meeting a new classmate. Practice saying, "Hi, my name is [Name]. What's your name?"

- **Scenario 2**

Act out a situation where the child joins a new group at the playground. Practice smiling, waving, and introducing themselves

- **Scenario 3**

Pretend the child feels shy about meeting someone. Practice taking a deep breath and saying, "Hi, I'm [Name]"
