Inviting someone to play is a great way to make new friends and share fun moments

Comprehension

- What can you say to invite someone to play?
A: "Hi, would you like to play with me?"
B: "Go away, I'm playing alone!"

- What can you do if someone says no to your invitation?
A: Smile and try again later or play on your own
B: Get upset and leave

- Why is it important to share and take turns when playing with others?
A: It makes the game more fun for everyone
B: It makes others feel upset

- What can you do if you feel nervous about inviting someone to play?
A: Stay quiet and not talk to anyone
B: Take a deep breath and try your best

Open-Ended Questions

- What can you say to invite someone to play with you?

Creative Activity

- **Design an Invitation**

Help the child create a colorful "Play Invitation" card they can use to invite friends to play

- **Friendship Art**

Ask the child to draw a picture of themselves playing with a friend they invited to join



Role-Play Activity

- **Scenario 1**

Pretend the child is playing with blocks, and another child walks by. Practice saying, "Hi, do you want to play with me?"

- **Scenario 2**

Act out a situation where the child is playing in a group and sees someone sitting alone. Practice saying, "Hi, would you like to join us?"

- **Scenario 3**

Pretend the invited person says no. Practice staying calm and saying, "That's okay. Maybe another time!"
