



Sometimes, I see a group of kids playing together or doing an activity, and I want to join them



Joining a group activity is a great way to have fun, make friends, and be part of the group



When I want to join a group, I can start by watching what they're doing



Next, I can wait for the right time to ask if I can join. I can choose a moment when they are not busy or in the middle of something



When I'm ready, I can say, 'Hi, can I play with you?' or 'Can I join your group?'



If they say yes, I can join in and follow the rules of the game or activity



If they say no, that's okay. I can wait and ask again later or find something else to do



It's important to take turns, share, and listen to others when I join a group activity



**If I don't understand the rules,
I can ask someone, 'How do I
play this game?'**



**Sometimes, I might need to
wait a little longer before I can
join the group, and that's okay
too**



If I accidentally interrupt the group, I can say, 'I'm sorry,' and wait for my turn



Being polite and kind helps everyone enjoy the activity and makes them happy I joined



Sometimes, the group might already be full, but I can always try another time



When I join a group activity, I feel proud because I'm being friendly and trying something new



**Now, I know that by waiting,
asking politely, and being kind,
I can join group activities and
have fun**

Comprehension

- What should you do first when you want to join a group?

A: Watch what they are doing

B: Jump in without asking

- What can you say to join a group?

A: "Hi, can I play with you?"

B: "Move over, I'm playing now!"

- What can you do if the group says no?

A: Wait and ask again later or find something else to do

B: Get upset and walk away

- Why is it important to follow the rules of the group?

A: It doesn't matter; you can play however you want

B: It helps everyone enjoy the activity

- What should you do if you accidentally interrupt the group?

A: Say, "I'm sorry," and wait for your turn

B: Keep talking until they notice you



Open-Ended Questions

- What can you say when you want to join a group activity?

- How do you feel when someone joins your group politely?

- What should you do if a group says no to joining them?

- How can you practice joining a group activity at home or school?



Creative Activity

- **Group Activity Poster**

Help the child create a colorful poster showing steps to join a group activity, like "Watch," "Ask," and "Play"

- **Draw Your Group**

Ask the child to draw a picture of themselves playing happily with a group of friends



Role-Play Activity

- **Scenario 1**

Pretend the child sees a group playing a ball game. Practice saying, "Hi, can I play with you?"

- **Scenario 2**

Act out a situation where the child wants to join an art project. Practice waiting, then saying, "Can I help with the painting?"

- **Scenario 3**

Pretend the group says no. Practice staying calm and saying, "That's okay, I'll try again later"
