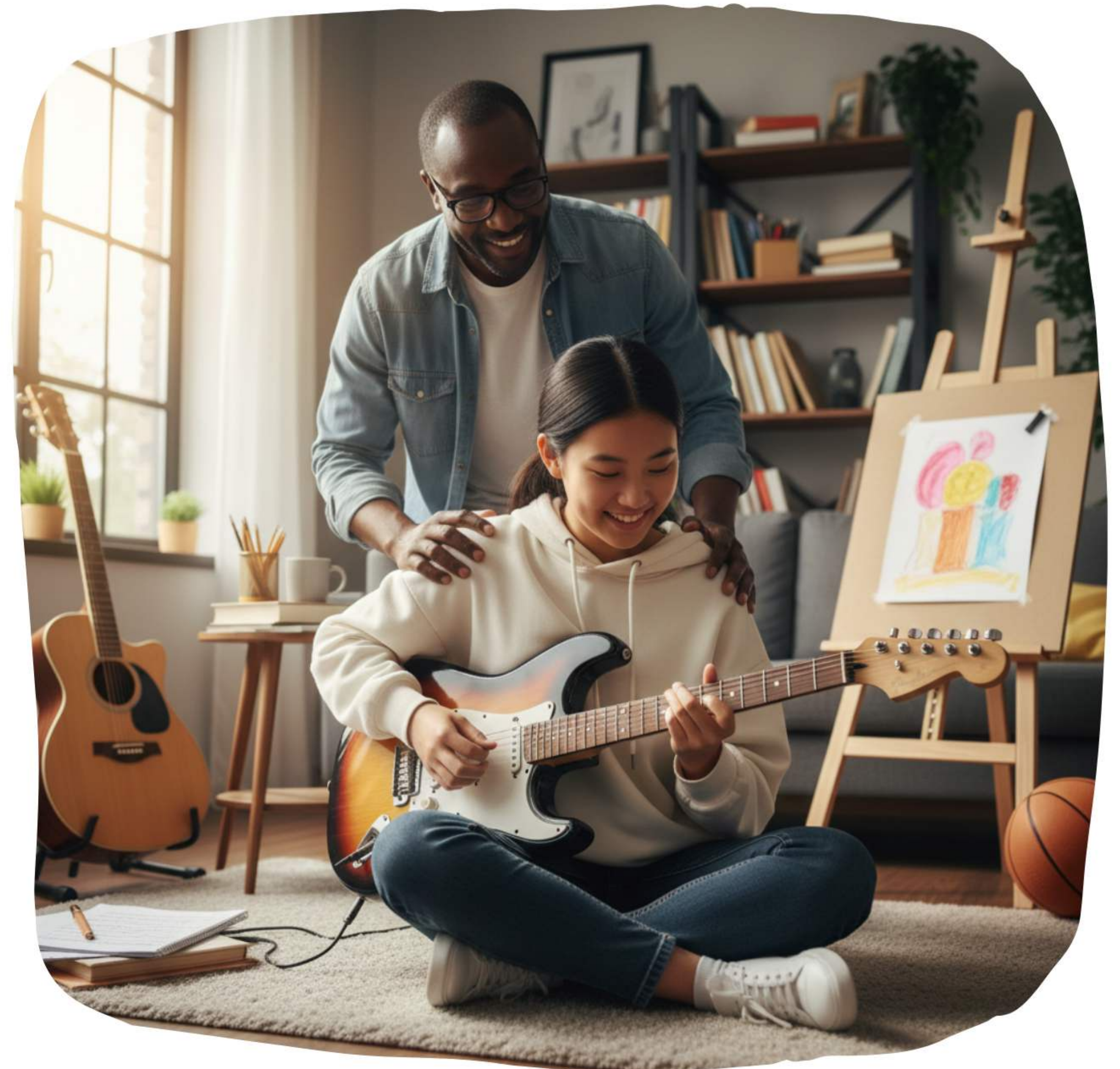

Recognizing My Unique Talents



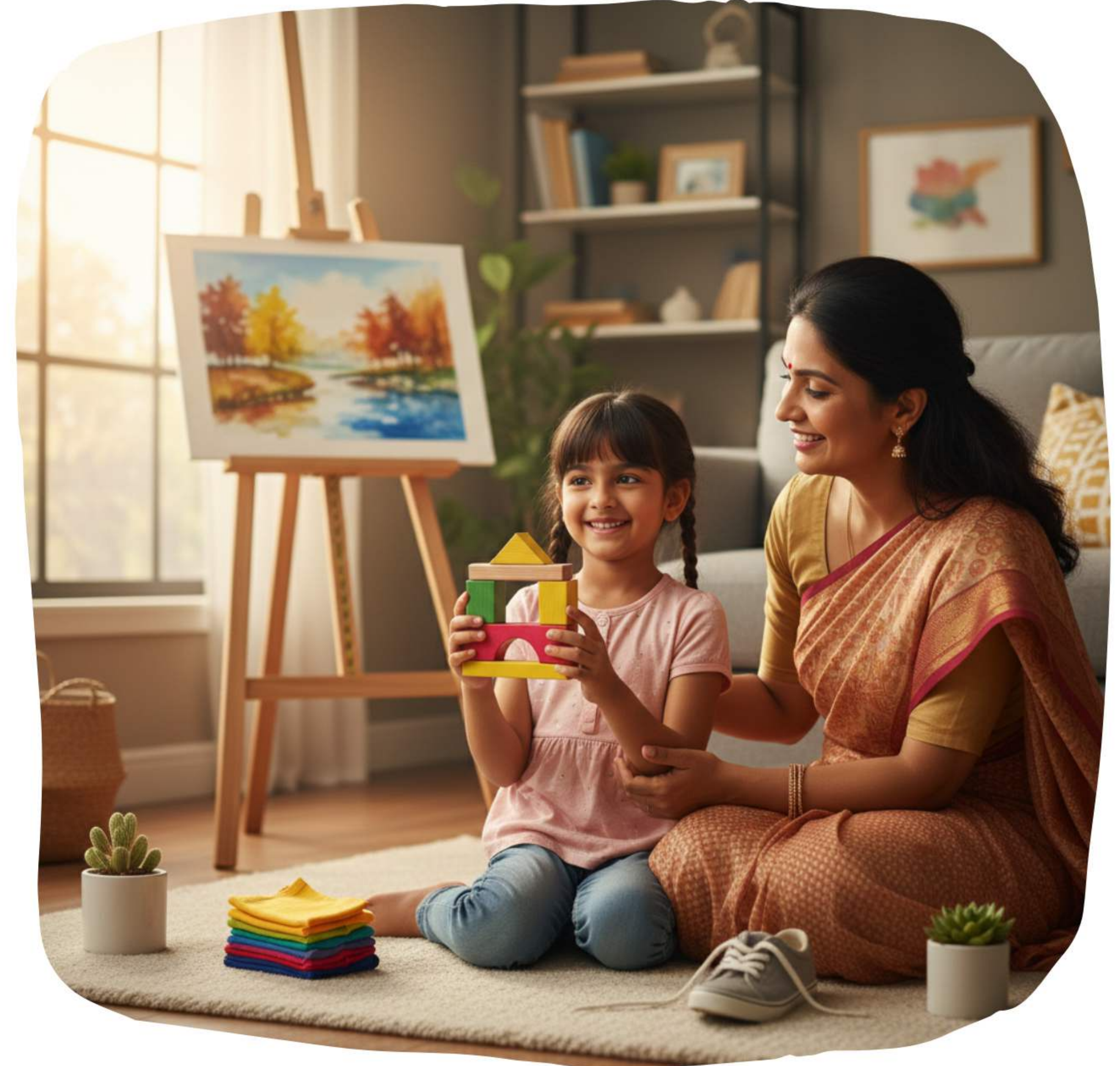
**“Everyone has different talents, and that’s what makes us unique.”**
