



When I'm around other people — at school, home, or in public — everyone has something called personal space.



Personal space is the area around someone's body that helps them feel safe and comfortable.



Everyone's personal space is different — some people like to stand close, and others like a little more room.



When I give others enough space, I show respect and good manners.



If I stand too close, lean, or touch someone without asking, they might feel uncomfortable or upset.



I can look at a person's body language to see if they need more space — if they step back or turn away, I can take a small step back too.



It's okay to give people space when they need it — it doesn't mean they don't like me.



I can always ask before touching someone or sitting very close.



When someone says “No” or “Please give me space,” I can listen and respect that.



In places like the classroom, bus, or store, I can keep my hands to myself and stay in my own space.



I can imagine a little “space bubble” around me that I keep safe and peaceful.



If I accidentally bump into someone, I can say, “Sorry!” and make sure they’re okay.



Sometimes, I like hugs or high-fives, but I can always ask first — “Can I give you a hug?”



Respecting space helps me build good friendships and helps others feel safe around me.



When I respect other people's space, teachers, friends, and parents feel proud of me.



Every time I give others space and keep my hands to myself, I make the world a kinder, safer place!

- **Scenario 1**
