



One day, I was playing a game with my friend. I got really excited and moved close to them to see what they were doing



My friend stepped back and said, 'Please give me some space.' I didn't know what they meant



Personal space is the area around a person where they feel comfortable. Everyone's personal space might be a little different



When I'm too close to someone, it can make them feel uncomfortable



Respecting personal space means giving people enough room to feel comfortable



When I talk to someone, I can stand an arm's length away. This gives them enough space



When I wait in line, I can stand behind the person in front of me without touching them



If I want to get someone's attention, I can say their name or wave instead of tapping them on the shoulder



Sometimes, I might not notice when I'm too close. If someone asks for space, I can take a step back



It's okay to tell someone nicely if they are too close to me. I can say, 'Could you please give me some space?'



I can practice giving personal space at home with my family and at school with my friends



When I give people personal space, it shows that I care about their feelings



Personal space is important because it helps everyone feel safe and comfortable



Sometimes, people might need more space if they feel upset or tired. That's okay too



Respecting personal space helps me have better friendships and makes playing together more fun



Now I know that giving personal space is a kind and thoughtful way to show I care about others

Open-Ended Questions

- What can you do if someone is standing too close to you?

- How does it feel when someone gives you personal space?

- What can you say to politely ask for space if someone is too close?

- How can you practice giving personal space to your friends and family?



Creative Activity

- **Personal Space Bubbles**

Use hula hoops or draw circles on the floor to represent personal space. Let the child practice standing inside their "bubble" while interacting with others

- **Draw Personal Space Rules**

Ask the child to draw or write three ways they can give others personal space, like standing an arm's length away or waiting in line without touching



Role-Play Activity

- **Scenario 1**

Pretend the child is playing with blocks, and another child walks by. Practice saying, "Hi, do you want to play with me?"

- **Scenario 2**

Act out a situation where the child is playing in a group and sees someone sitting alone. Practice saying, "Hi, would you like to join us?"

- **Scenario 3**

Pretend the invited person says no. Practice staying calm and saying, "That's okay. Maybe another time!"
