



One morning, I walked into my classroom, and my teacher said, 'Good morning!' but I didn't know what to say back



My teacher explained that a greeting is when someone says hello or acknowledges me. It's polite to respond to a greeting



There are different types of greetings, like saying, 'Hi,' 'Good morning,' or just waving



When someone greets me, I can look at them, smile, and respond with a polite greeting back



---

**If someone waves at me, I can wave back to show I saw them**



---

**Sometimes, I might feel shy, but I can still say, 'Hi,' or wave to be polite**



**If I don't hear a greeting right away, I can say, 'Hi,' when I notice them**



**If someone says, 'How are you?' I can answer politely with, 'I'm good, thank you,' and ask, 'How are you?'**



**Sometimes, people might use greetings like a handshake, high-five, or fist bump. I can respond in the same way**



**When I respond to greetings, it shows that I'm kind and paying attention to others**

**If I forget to respond, I can always turn around and say, 'Hi!' or wave to them later**



---

**Sometimes, I might not feel like talking, but a small wave or a smile still shows I care**



---

**Responding to greetings helps me make new friends and build good relationships**



---

**I can practice greetings at home with my family and with my friends at school**



**Now I know how to respond when someone greets me. I can use my words, a smile, or a wave!**



**Responding to greetings makes me feel good and helps others feel noticed and happy too!**

## Comprehension

- What is a greeting?

A: Saying hello or waving to someone

B: Ignoring someone when they speak

## Open-Ended Questions

- How do you feel when someone greets you with a smile or a wave?

- What can you do if you feel shy when someone says hello?

- Why is it important to greet others politely?

- What is your favorite way to greet someone? Saying hello, waving, or giving a high-five?



## Creative Activity

- **Greeting Cards**

Help the child create simple greeting cards with kind messages like "Hi!" or "How are you?" They can practice giving these to family or friends

- **Greeting Practice**

Create small flashcards with different greetings ("Hi," "Good morning," "Hello!") and let the child practice responding to each one



## Role-Play Activity

- **Scenario 1**

Pretend someone says, "Good morning!" Practice smiling and saying, "Good morning!" back

- **Scenario 2**

Act out a situation where someone waves. Practice waving back with a smile

- **Scenario 3**

Pretend a teacher says, "How are you?" Practice saying, "I'm good, thank you. How are you?"
