Sharing means letting someone else use something I have for a little while



Taking turns means one person plays first, and then another person plays next



When I share and take turns, it shows kindness and helps everyone feel included



If I want to use a toy someone else is playing with, I can say, 'Can I have a turn, please?' and wait patiently



If my friend says no, I can play with something else until it's my turn



Sometimes, I might not feel like sharing, but sharing makes games more fun for everyone



When I feel frustrated about waiting, I can take a deep breath or count to 10 to stay calm



If I accidentally take someone's turn, I can say, 'I'm sorry,' and let them go next



**When someone shares with me,
I can say, 'Thank you!' to show
I appreciate their kindness**

patience and helps everyone
get a chance to play**



**Sharing also makes my friends
feel happy and want to play

Comprehension

Open-Ended Questions

Creative Activity

- **Turn-Taking Game**

Use a simple game like rolling a ball or stacking blocks. Encourage the child to practice saying, "Your turn" and "My turn"

- **Sharing Poster**

Help the child draw or write examples of sharing, like sharing toys, books, or snacks, and decorate the poster with stickers



Role-Play Activity

- **Scenario 1**

Pretend the child has a toy car, and a friend asks for a turn. Practice saying, "Here you go!" and smiling as they hand over the car

- **Scenario 2**

Act out a situation where the child wants to play with a toy another child is using. Practice saying, "Can I have a turn, please?"

- **Scenario 3**

Pretend the child feels frustrated while waiting. Practice taking a deep breath and saying, "I'll play with something else until it's my turn"
