



One day, I asked my friend for a toy, but I forgot to say 'please.' They looked a little upset and didn't give me the toy right away



My teacher told me that polite words, like 'please,' 'thank you,' and 'sorry,' are important to show kindness and respect



Saying 'please' is a nice way to ask for something. It shows that I care about the other person's feelings



When someone gives me something or helps me, I can say 'thank you.' It shows that I appreciate them



If I make a mistake or hurt someone, I can say ‘I’m sorry.’ It shows that I care about making things right



Using polite words can make people feel happy and respected



When I want to borrow a toy, I can say, ‘Can I use this, please?’



If someone shares something with me, like a snack, I can say, ‘Thank you!’



If I bump into someone by accident, I can stop and say, 'I'm sorry. Are you okay?'



Polite words can also help when I need help. I can say, 'Excuse me, can you help me, please?'



Sometimes, I might forget to use polite words, but I can always remind myself to try again



Using polite words shows that I care about others and makes them feel good



I can practice saying polite words with my family, friends, and teachers



When I use polite words, I feel proud because I know I'm being kind and thoughtful



Now, I know how to use polite words like 'please,' 'thank you,' and 'sorry' to show kindness and respect



Polite words make every day better by spreading kindness and making people feel good!

Creative Activity

- **Polite Word Poster**

Help the child create a colorful poster with the polite words "Please," "Thank You," and "Sorry," and examples of when to use them

- **Polite Word Coloring**

Provide printable sheets with the words "Please," "Thank You," and "Sorry" in big letters for the child to color and decorate



Role-Play Activity

- **Scenario 1**

Pretend the child wants to borrow a toy. Practice saying, "Can I use this, please?"

- **Scenario 2**

Act out a situation where someone helps the child. Practice saying, "Thank you!"

- **Scenario 3**

Pretend the child accidentally bumps into someone. Practice saying, "I'm sorry. Are you okay?"
