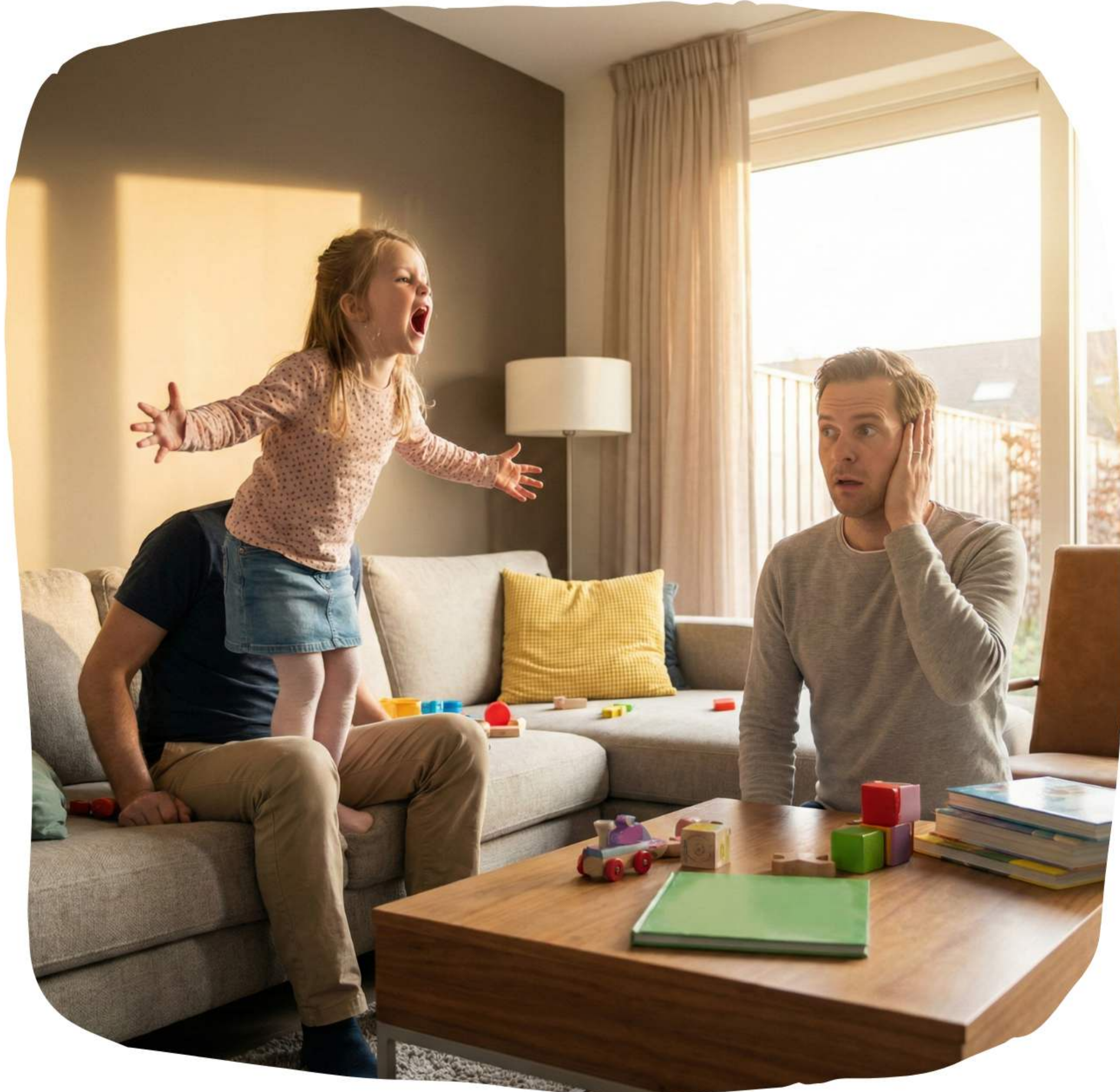


**Sometimes, I go to public places like restaurants, libraries, malls, or hospitals with my family or school.**

gentle.**



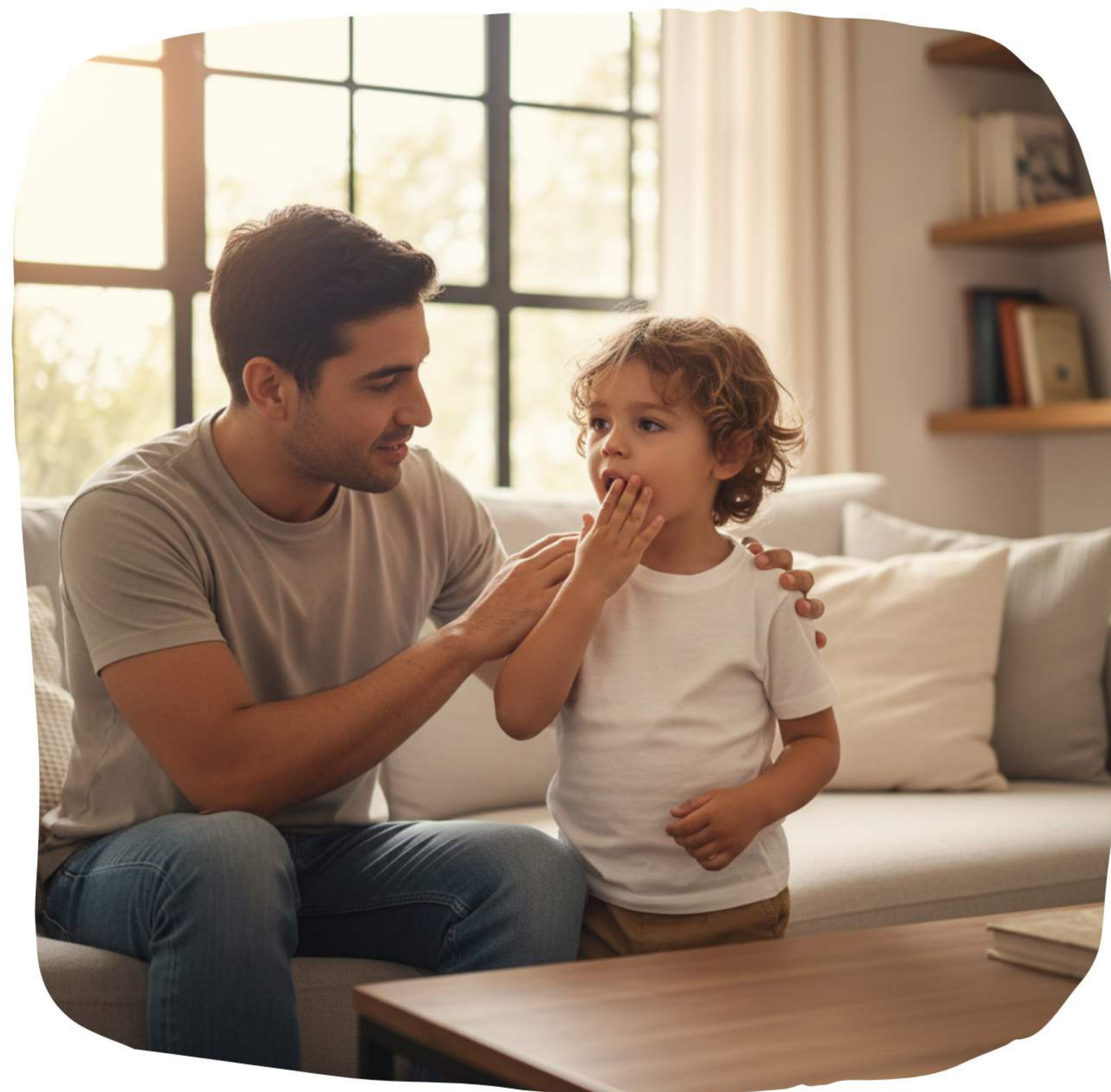
**I can tell I'm using my inside voice when people near me can hear me, but others far away cannot.**



**My inside voice shows respect and helps everyone enjoy a peaceful space.**



**I can look around and notice how others are behaving. If they're quiet, that's a clue that I should be quiet too.**



**If I forget and speak loudly, I can stop, take a breath, and lower my voice right away.**



**I can use my inside voice in places like the library, restaurant, classroom, or doctor's office.**



**At home or on the playground, I can use my outside voice — louder and more energetic.**



**My teacher or parent might remind me, “Inside voice, please.” That means I need to speak more softly.**



**I can practice using different voice levels — whisper, soft voice, and loud voice — to learn when to use each one.**



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**Using my inside voice helps others feel comfortable and calm.**



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**It also helps me listen and focus better on what's happening around me.**



**When I use an inside voice, I show good manners and self-control in public places.**



**Each time I remember to use my inside voice, I make public places calm, kind, and enjoyable for everyone!**
