I use my inside voice and walk slowly so I don't disturb others.



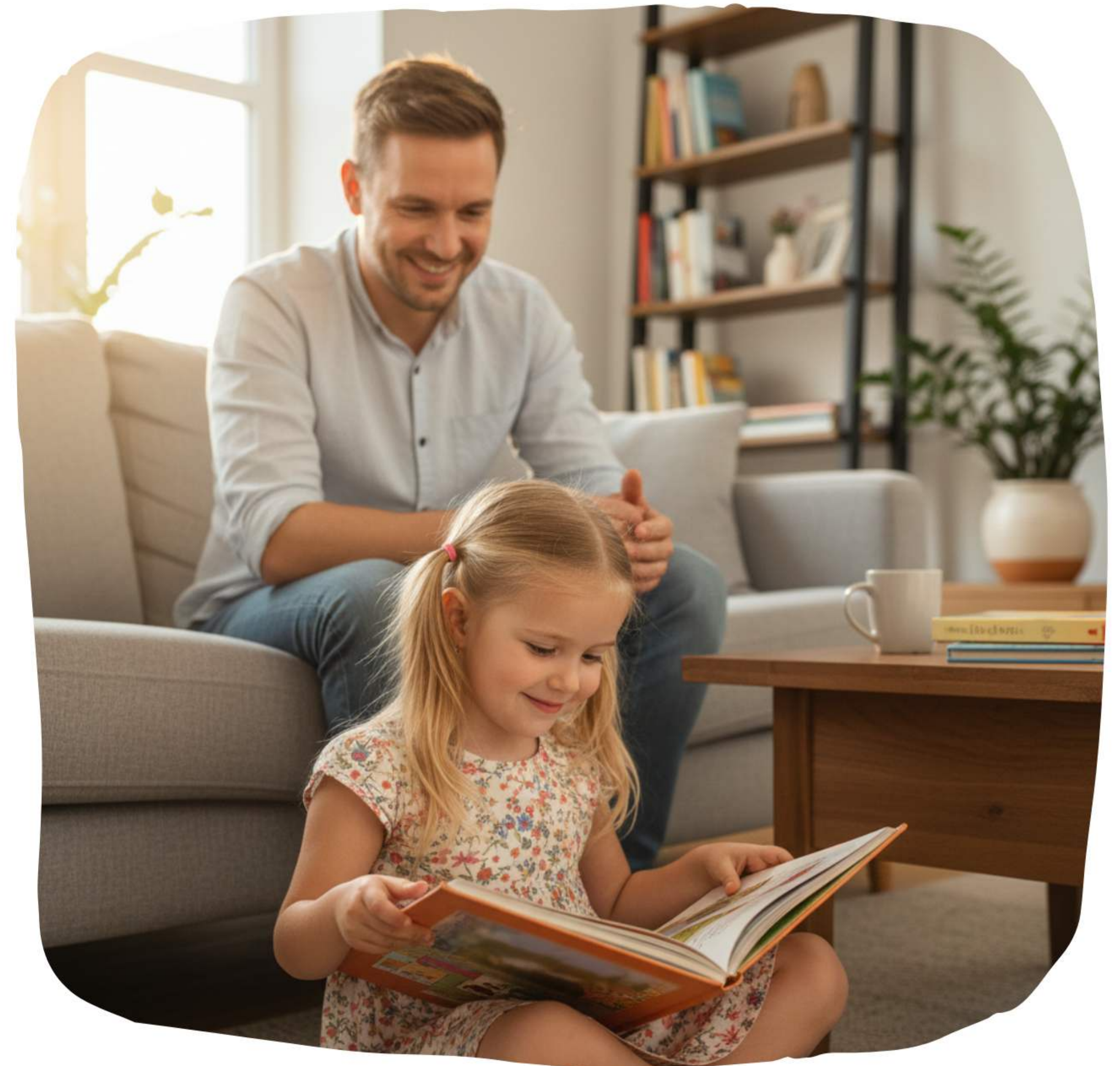
If I need help finding a book, I can ask the librarian politely.

I can look at picture books, storybooks, or fact books — there's something for everyone.



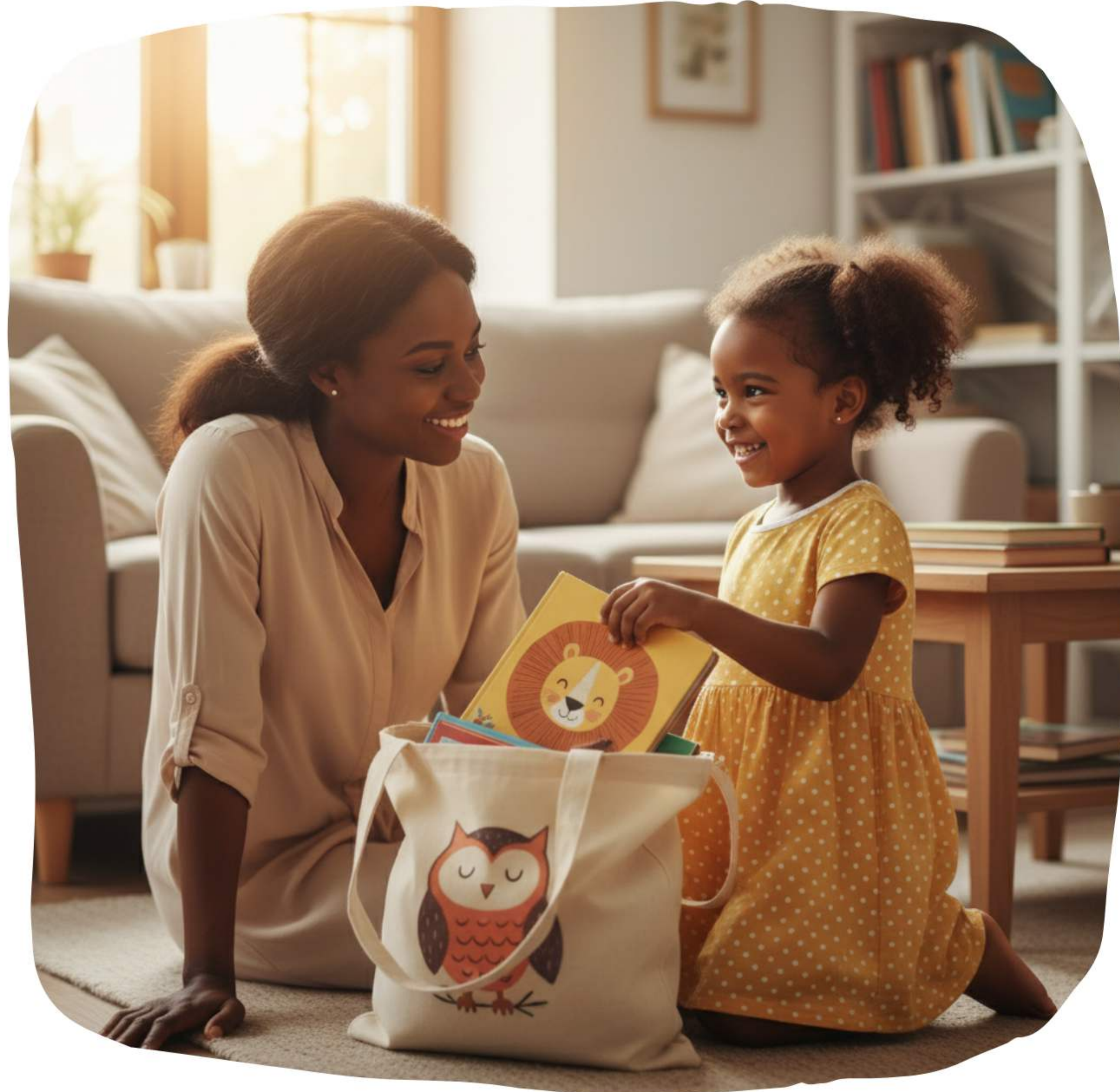
When I pick up a book, I hold it carefully with clean hands.
